Central Gulf: Installation of Bahrain LNG Terminal Subsea Pipe line

The BLNG sub-sea pipe line construction will commence on third week of January 2018, and last up to the end of August 2018.

The work will be between Khalifa Bin Salman Port (KBSP) break water and the BLNG jetty. During this period, various marine transportation / work activities will also take place to / from and along the work corridor on 24 hour bases. The work area is bounded by the following coordinates:

Safety / Security boat will be guarding the area listening, mariners are requested to navigate with caution, maintain constant listening to safety / security boats on VHF-CH 74.
